OSLT participants must be permanent residents or protected persons who have:

- training or experience in a specific occupation or sector, but need to improve occupation-specific language skills.
- language proficiency at Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) levels 6 to 8 in at least one language skill area, or Niveaux de compétence linguistique canadiens (NCLC) of 6 to 8 for courses taught in French.
